Expanded EU Allergen Requirements

Rosemary essential oil is a complex natural substance. In addition to the historically declared fragrance allergens above, Regulation (EU) 2023/1545 introduced additional individually labelled allergens and grouped botanical-source entries.

A definitive declaration covering the complete expanded EU list requires:

- Batch-specific GC-MS or validated compositional data
- Supplier quantitative allergen information
- Evaluation of oxidation products where relevant
- Calculation based on the ingredient's concentration in the finished cosmetic

Labelling Thresholds in Finished Cosmetics

Individual fragrance-allergen labelling is generally required when the relevant allergen exceeds:

Product Type	Finished-Product Threshold
Leave-on products	0.001%
Rinse-off products	0.01%

Declaration

Rosemary Essential Oil is expected to contain naturally occurring limonene and may contain linalool, together with lower or trace quantities of other fragrance allergens depending on the chemotype, harvest, geographical conditions and storage history.

The statuses given above are qualitative and must not be interpreted as batch-specific quantitative results. Exact allergen percentages should be taken from the applicable supplier analysis or GC-MS report before issuing a quantitative regulatory declaration.

The finished cosmetic manufacturer remains responsible for calculating the concentration of each declarable allergen in the finished product and applying the required ingredient labelling.
