Declaration

Green Pepper Essential Oil is a natural essential oil. It naturally contains fragrance allergen constituents that are listed in Annex III of Regulation (EC) No. 1223/2009, as amended by Commission Regulation (EU) 2023/1545.

The concentrations of these naturally occurring constituents may vary between production batches depending on origin, harvest conditions, climate, and distillation process.

Typical naturally occurring EU declarable fragrance allergens include:

Regulatory Statement

This document identifies the fragrance allergens that may naturally occur in Green Pepper Essential Oil. Manufacturers of finished cosmetic products are responsible for determining whether these allergens exceed the applicable declaration thresholds in the finished product.

Current EU cosmetic labelling thresholds are:

Leave-on cosmetic products: 0.001% (10 ppm)

Rinse-off cosmetic products: 0.01% (100 ppm)
