IFRA STATEMENT

This certificate provides information regarding the compliance of the above-mentioned fragrance ingredient with the International Fragrance Association (IFRA) Standards – 51st Amendment.

Aniseed Myrtle Oil is a Natural Complex Substance (NCS) obtained by steam distillation of the leaves and young twigs of *Syzygium anisatum*.

Based on the current IFRA Standards – 51st Amendment, Aniseed Myrtle Oil is not subject to an individual IFRA Standard or a specific quantitative restriction as a raw material.

However, Aniseed Myrtle Oil naturally contains a high proportion of trans-Anethole (typically 80–95%), together with minor naturally occurring constituents such as estragole, anisaldehyde and monoterpenes. Although trans-Anethole is not individually restricted under the current IFRA Standards, the complete fragrance formulation must always be evaluated for compliance with all applicable IFRA Standards and any restrictions applicable to other ingredients present.
