2. CERTIFICATE STATEMENT

Aromology Trading LLC certifies that Frankincense Essential Oil (Somalia) has been reviewed against the IFRA Standards published under the 51st Amendment.

Based on the information available for the material, *Boswellia Carterii* Gum Oil is not subject, as a complete natural raw material, to a specific IFRA prohibition or direct category-based maximum-use restriction under the 51st Amendment.

Accordingly, no single universal maximum concentration is assigned to the complete essential oil across IFRA Categories 1–12.

However, this material is a Natural Complex Substance and may contain naturally occurring constituents that are individually covered by IFRA Standards. The permitted concentration of the essential oil in a finished fragrance must therefore be calculated from:



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- The concentration of each restricted constituent in the actual batch.
- The applicable IFRA limit for that constituent.
- The intended finished-product category.
- Contributions of the same constituent from all other ingredients in the formulation.

IFRA confirms that a Certificate of Conformity is a supplier declaration and does not replace a complete safety assessment of the finished product.

“No material-specific maximum established” does not mean unrestricted use. It means that the complete oil has no direct IFRA use limit identified in this assessment, while restrictions applicable to its individual constituents must still be respected.

4. NATURALLY OCCURRING CONSTITUENTS REQUIRING CONSIDERATION

Representative constituents that may require review in the finished formulation include:

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Estragole 140-67-0 Restricted constituent; quantify when detected

The presence and concentration of these constituents must be established using the relevant batch GC-MS, supplier specification or other suitable analytical data.

5. CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITY

The fragrance compounder or finished-product manufacturer is responsible for:

1. Identifying the correct IFRA product category.
2. Obtaining current batch-specific compositional data.
3. Calculating the total contribution of restricted constituents from every formulation ingredient.
4. Applying the most restrictive relevant IFRA Standard.
5. Conducting a complete toxicological and cosmetic safety assessment.
6. Meeting all applicable national and regional legal requirements.
7. Confirming compliance with any IFRA amendment adopted after the 51st Amendment where applicable.

This certificate applies only to the material identified above and must not be interpreted as approval of any finished fragrance or cosmetic product.
